We truly knew that night that we were not alone. We could tangibly see it, feel it, and hear it.

### THE REV. MARTIN R. HALOM ELECTED BISHOP OF THE NORTHWEST SYNOD OF WISCONSIN – ELCA

The Rev. Martin R. Halom was elected June 8, 2024, to a six-year term as bishop of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) at the synod's assembly June 7-8 in Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

"Christ, be our light! Shine in our hearts. Shine through the darkness. Christ, be our light! Shine in your church gathered today." This refrain, from the song, Christ Be Our Light, will be my guiding principle. In all that I do, in all that I say, Christ will be the central purpose.

Halom was elected on the fourth ballot receiving 241 votes of 354 votes cast. The Rev. Karen Behling, currently serving Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Chippewa Falls received 57 votes and the Rev. Diane House, currently the Director of Evangelical Mission for the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin, received 56 votes.


The bishop-elect is pastor at St. John's Lutheran Church in Bloomer, Wisconsin. He has served that congregation since 2012. Prior to that, he was campus pastor at University Lutheran Church, East Lansing, Michigan (2003-2012); associate pastor, American Lutheran Church, Rantoul, Illinois. (1999-2003); youth and family ministries director, Mt. Carmel Lutheran Church, Minneapolis, Minnesota (1995-1997), youth ministry associate, Lutherdale Bible Camp, Elkhorn, Wisconsin (1994-1995), and program associate at Green Lake Bible Camp, Spicer, Minnesota (1993-1994).

Halom earned a Bachelor of Arts degree at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa and a Masters of Divinity at Luther Seminary, St. Paul, Minn. He and his wife, the Rev. Melinda Halom, have three grown sons, Nicholas, Jaden, and Dylan. His installation as bishop will be September 15, 2024, at Hope Lutheran, Eau Claire at 3:00 p.m.

### How You Can Compost

Many of us do not think about where our trash goes and the ever growing landfill. For most of us, our trash goes to the 7 Mile Landfill which recently went through an expansion and is projected for another expansion within 10 years. A DNR audit revealed that nearly 40% of landfill waste could be composted including food scraps and some paper products. Composting can and does make a big difference in reducing landfill space and reducing methane gas created by the landfill.

- If you are thinking of composting, below are two options: 1. Home Composting: If you are interested in composting at home, bins and kitchen pails are available through Eau Claire County Office of Recycling and Sustainability.   - 2. Subscribe to Curbside Composting: If you would like to compost, but prefer not to have a compost bin on your property, you can use the trash hauler, EarthBound Environmental Solutions,

https://www.earthboundenviro.com/. They offer trash hauling, recycling and compost pick up.

## REFLECTIONS FROM THE ELCA YOUTH GATHERING

After spending a year preparing, and six years waiting for it to happen again, our team has returned from the ELCA Youth Gathering! Our team of 16 youth and 4 adults -- plus Laura Ramlow, who traveled with us and served as our Synod Champion, had an amazing experience! We were thankful to experience very little in the way of travel issues, while many others were dealing with weather on the way there & the internet issue on the way back!

Our team was amazing - they handled all the walking (over 10 miles a day) and the heat ("feels like" temp of over 100) with positive attitudes and a can-do spirit. We let them know ahead of time that this would be a trip where they would need to be willing to step outside their comfort zone and try new things, and they did! The programming we experienced was top notch. On our Interactive Learning day we were able to explore booths and activities of many ELCA ministry partners and learn more about all the ways the ELCA is making a difference throughout the world. For Accompaniment Day, we got to hop on a bus with two other groups and head to a city park where we helped to clean up trash and put a fresh coat of paint on some of the posts and benches there. During our Synod Day we explored the city with a Goosechase Scavenger Hunt, then worshiped with about 1700 others from Wisconsin and the UP. Each day ended with a Mass Gathering in Smoothie King Arena, where we heard from speakers who shared stories of hope, resilience, and confidence all while encouraging each of us to be true to the person God created each of us to be. The musicians were incredibly talented, as well as fun and engaging! Worshiping in a space with over 16,000 other Lutherans mainly teenagers - is a feeling that cannot be described, only experienced. In our free time we were able to explore the city of New Orleans, and we were sure to try many new and local foods such as fried alligator, oysters and gumbo. And, of course, we took a trip to Cafe du Monde for beignets! While we were out in the city we heard from several people how thankful they were that the Gathering was in town, and how they could really see us making a big impact in our short amount of time.
